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## You And The Materials Exchange Program

You and your organization get the *Link*, browse through the listings, make a couple of exchanges a year, and get an occasional phone call about any listings you have. This may be all you know about our program. You may have no idea how many other participants are involved, or how much of an impact the Exchange is having. Read on and you will discover you are part of something big.

As a participant of the Nebraska Materials Exchange Program, you are in good company. Since the program began in 1994, over 1,000 participants have listed items, from individuals to multi-national corporations. Numerous industries are represented, along with mar schools, government o tions, small businesses individuals from every part of Nebraska, as well as out-of-state organizations. The diversity of the program participants is the strength of the program. The total number of past and current listings is now beyond 3,500.

If you've made any matches in the Exchange, you have contributed to the following:

- 1,059 matches
- 1,600,000 pounds of material matched
- \$331,450 avoided disposal cost
- \$1,649,524 avoided purchase cost

That is quite an impact—and you've helped by being a part of it.

If you are a typical participant you've been involved with one or two items, and you may not realize the diversity of materials that are exchanged. Everyday matches involve

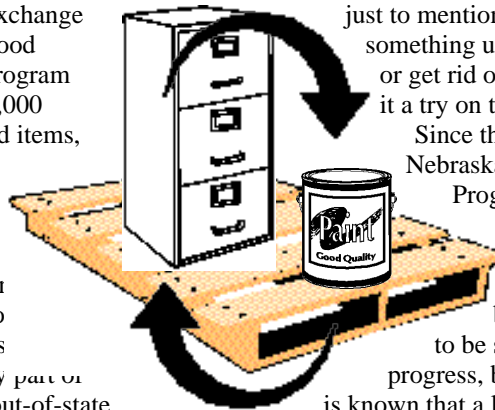
materials like computers, other electronics, pallets, buckets, drums, gaylords, packing materials, office furniture, office supplies, plastic bags, paint, and numerous recyclables. Yet matches can be made with almost anything, as shown in the following list of some of the more unusual exchanges. These include track hurdles, forklifts, dog shampoo, soap dispensers, a fire whistle, marking flags, chandeliers, and railroad car hatch covers,

just to mention a few. So if you have something unusual you need to find or get rid of, don't be afraid to give it a try on the Exchange.

Since the inception of the Nebraska Materials Exchange Program in 1994, much has been accomplished and a great impact has been made. It would be easy for the program

to be satisfied with this progress, but that is not the case. It

is known that a large amount of usable material is still going to waste by being sent to the landfill. Some organizations and individuals still haven't been made aware of the program, or have not found a way to become involved. For this reason the Exchange Program continues to try to build on its successes, to grow and make an even greater impact. You can be a part of this growth by letting others know about the program, and continuing to be involved as you have in the past. Your efforts are greatly appreciated because they contribute to the continuing success of the program. If you haven't become involved yet, please do. You will find that the staff at the Nebraska Materials Exchange Program will do their friendly best to answer your questions and help you in any way they can.

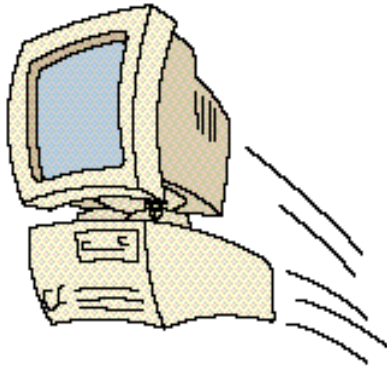
# THE EXCHANGE FILES

## A CLOSER EXAMINATION: Success Stories

### Orleans Library

This match is a perfect example of how the Materials Exchange program can work. We received a call from the Orleans Library and they informed us that one of their computers crashed permanently and they desperately needed a replacement. We didn't have anything available in our current listings but with a few calls to past participants we found an answer.

Platte Valley State Bank in Kearney, who had donated computers in the past, had another one available to donate. A member of the library staff was able to pick it up the next day, and the library is now back up to full speed.



### Computer Spring Cleaning

Apparently numerous individuals and organizations decided it was time to clear their closets of older computers this spring. During this last quarter there were 18 exchanges of computers, involving 55 complete units and over 16,000 additional pounds of miscellaneous computer equipment.

### Vinyl Recovered

Tri-Con Industries had several partial rolls, totaling over 3,000 pounds, of industrial vinyl that they could no longer use. We were able to match them with another Lincoln business, Perfect Touch Binding, who will use the vinyl in a variety of ways.

### Envelopes Sent to New Home

A grand total of 71,000 envelopes were matched in one exchange in April. Pioneer Publishing in Friend made this donation to University Printing Service in Lincoln.

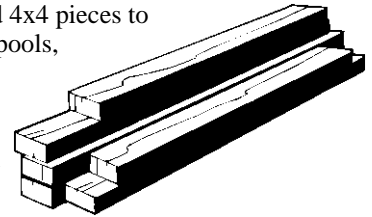


## IN EXCESS: Surplus Materials

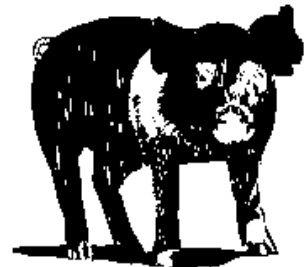


### Crates and Boxes

### Older Computers, Printers

A number of calls are received regularly from individuals and organizations who need to get rid of one or two older computers (386 and below) and printers. We generally are able to get these to a recycler but if you or someone you know can use a single older computer or printer we would be thrilled to try to get you one. Contact us and let us know what you need and we will do our best to make a match for you.

# Pesticide Container Recycling Program

If you have pesticide containers and you live in Nebraska there is likely a collection site near you. This year there are 62 sites across the state where pesticide containers can be taken for recycling.

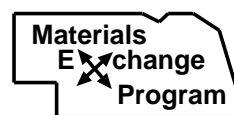
The Pesticide Container Recycling program, administered by Larry Schulze at the University of Nebraska Cooperative Extension, has grown substantially over its nine year history. During that time over 300 tons of plastic pesticide containers were collected and recycled, with 71 tons last year alone. Although the program is a booming success, the number of containers collected still only represent 25 percent of the total number that could be recycled. That means there is still plenty of room for growth.



The program accepts all pressure or triple-rinsed 1- and 2.5-gallon plastic pesticide containers. Select sites also accept larger containers. Check with your collection site if you have larger containers to recycle. All containers are inspected and must be clean and drained, with caps, shrink wrap, and booklets removed.

Sites vary in their collection period, either year round, throughout the summer, or on specific dates only. To find out more about collection site locations and dates, or other details, contact your local extension agent or check the UNL Pesticide Education website at <pested.unl.edu/pestrecy.htm>.

## Mowed Over By Compost

Nowhere to go with the bags of lawn waste generated every week? Why not treat your lawn to a boost of nutrients present in the clippings. Leaving the clippings on your lawn, or grasscycling, is the natural way to recycle the clippings and improve the health of your turf. Grasscycling reduces the need for fertilizer, saves you time and money, and saves tax dollars by reducing the strain on landfills.

If you prefer to bag your clippings (or your grass is just growing too fast) but you have no outlet, consider composting. Composting, if done correctly, can be a simple, clean, odor-free way to deal with yard waste—with only a few minutes of your time each week. The best news is that you generate a highly desirable material in the process, that can be used to improve the structure and fertility of your soil.

How does composting work? A wide variety of microorganisms, insects, and worms feed on the various components of the compost pile, allowing it to break down into valuable humus. The creation of compost is a very natural process. The only thing the homeowner affects is the speed of the decomposition. If you are patient, simply throw everything in a pile and wait. But you can reduce the process time dramatically by following a few simple steps.

One key to making good, odor-free compost, is to use a variety of materials, some rich in carbon ("browns"—dry leaves are best) and some rich in nitrogen ("greens"—grass clippings are perfect) and a little soil. The soil gives the microorganisms to assist in breaking it down. A rule of thumb is to use about 1/2 browns and 1/2 greens on the composition of each. Vegetable egg shells are desirable, but any meat scraps are not. The fat in meat interferes with the activity of the microorganisms, plus it can attract scavengers. Moisture level of the compost is important too: it should be damp, not dusty dry and not dripping wet. If you use a container, it should have plenty of ventilation. Ventilation speeds up the process and prevents odors. Another factor is size. The bigger the pile the longer the microorganisms can do their work. Smaller piles will still break down, but it will occur more

slowly, with pillbugs and earthworms doing most of the work.

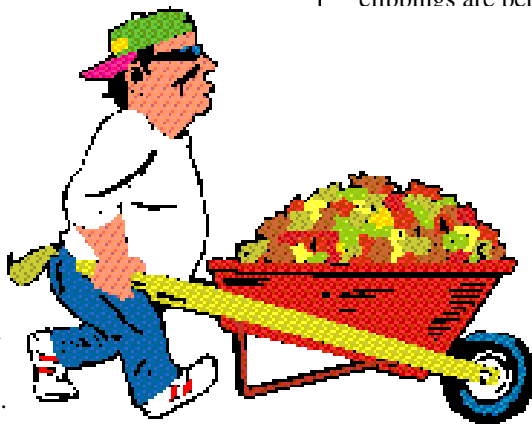
**Four simple steps to successful composting:**

1. Obtain and mix together a variety of materials: some browns, some greens, and a little soil
2. Add water if too dry, or dry ingredients if too wet
3. Create a pile (remember size and ventilation)
4. Turn and mix occasionally, adjusting moisture level if necessary

Although the time to finished compost varies depending on methods and materials used, it can be ready in just a couple of months. Finished compost has a dark color, earthy smell, and the components are broken down into tiny pieces. Now it's ready to add to your garden, use as a potting mix, or use as mulch in your landscape. Your plants will love you for it, and you will be happy with the results.

### Lawn Care Tips

- Keep mower blades sharp. A sharp blade makes a clean cut, reducing risk of fungal disease.
- Remove no more than one third of the grass blade at each mowing. More than that and you risk damaging the plants plus the clippings are too long to leave on the lawn.
- Increase mowing height during warmer months. This helps shade the crown of grass plants and keeps the soil and roots cooler.
- Mow only when the lawn is dry, especially when not bagging.
- Fertilize appropriately. Over-fertilization causes excessive growth, weakens the grass, increases risk of fungal diseases, and increases risk of run-off.
- Water lawns in the early morning. This reduces water loss due to evaporation and risk of fungal disease.
- Your lawn needs approximately one inch of water per week. Infrequent watering (1-2 times per week) is best for the grass. Over-watering and too frequent watering creates a shallow root system and weakens the turf.
- Apply pesticides only when and where necessary. Preventative insecticides and fungicides, and blanket herbicide applications are seldom warranted.

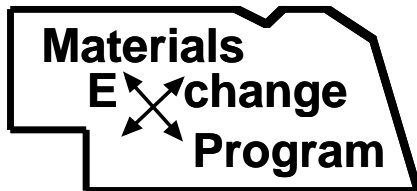

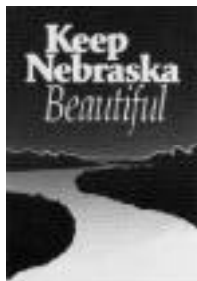
